Mission Statement, SLOs, Curriculum Map, & Three-year Assessment Plan

Mission Statement Rubric: All academic programs & co-curricular programs require a mission that align with the College and Division mission. The mission statement is concise statement outlining the purpose of the program, who it serves, in what ways, and with what result. Mission statements should be assessed ever three years by the SLA Departmental Coordinator.

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Student Learning Outcomes Rubric: Student learning outcomes are a list of things that graduates of a department/program should be able to know or do. You should have no more than six learning outcomes. These outcomes should be derived from the mission and guide assessment strategy. Many departments/programs with discipline-specific accreditation may use accreditor standards as learning outcomes or student competency goals.

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Curriculum Map Rubric: A curriculum map is a way to map student learning outcomes directly to the courses (or co-curricular programs) through which they are assessed. It is a simple tool that helps to clarify how and in what classes students are being prepared to master each student learning outcome. Curriculum maps are only used by academic units.

An imbalance of Introduced, Practiced, or Reinforced (IPR) shows gaps or overlaps in the curriculum. Curriculum map is not up to date.	A single, current curriculum map is used to list specific courses/programs in alphanumeric order and describe an appropriate balance of IPR between and across courses. The curriculum map is up to date. When the curriculum changes, the same curriculum map is edited to reflect changes.	The current curriculum map organizes courses/programs to represent IPR in sequential progression, grouping by topic, or by academic year (unless there is no logical reason to provide such organization). When the curriculum changes, new maps are copied and edited (making multiple curriculum maps) to describe changes in curriculum.		

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Three-year Assessment Cycle Plan Rubric: The three-year assessment cycle plan is the way that departments/programs will assess their SLOs, within a given academic year.
